



These Google maps give the next 3 locations where photos were taken as well as view 2 which is where the border patrol truck was parked.

So far, in the last 12 pictures, only two brick manufacturing plants and one American diversion dam are the only structures in the immediate area but no structures other than the levees along the river. No other commercial activities along the river exist.

This probably is the least appreciated area along the border. It has three states that meet, strategically located between two major cities along the border and accessible by major roads from both cities.
